Local Business Success: Learning Through Drama

Hetty Beetham had dreamed of becoming a primary school teacher from the age of 7, eventually she fulfilled that dream. She worked as a primary school teacher for 8 years and loved it. During this time Hetty helped to set up an independent school and became a healthy schools consultant, she really enjoyed the business side of these experiences, such as planning her own time and marketing a service, this coupled with Hetty's strong belief in creative learning led her to setting up her business, Learning Through Drama as a sole trader. During her time as a teacher, Hetty found that children did better in subjects where drama was used to assist in their learning so her business idea was to provide a service to schools by providing drama days.

Learning Through Drama has now been up and running for over three years and Hetty has worked tirelessly to develop and grow the business, moving away from drama days and concentrating on after school workshops and academies' as well as offering children the opportunity to work towards the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art (LAMDA) awards through speech and drama tuition. Learning Through Drama students can expect to learn skills that will benefit them throughout life, such as communication, team working and presentation skills as well as gaining self-confidence. The business went Ltd in September 2008 and Hetty now employs 9 members of staff including 5 fully qualified teachers, 2 administrators and 2 assistants. "One of the hardest parts of taking on employees was letting go and letting other people in".

Before starting in business Hetty attended a free Introduction to Starting in Business training session, which is part of the Business Skills Training Programme offered by Amber Valley Borough Council and Business Link. "The training confirmed a lot of things for me but also raised my awareness and threw up questions about issues I hadn't thought of, so afterwards I arranged to meet a Business Link advisor who was fantastic". Since starting her business Hetty has joined the Chamber of Commerce, she entered their business awards and was a finalist in the 'Most Promising New Business' category, a tremendous and well-deserved achievement.



Business Funding

Amber Valley Borough Council is currently running three grant schemes for businesses based in Amber Valley.

- Shop Front Grants
- Resource Efficiency Grants
- Commercial Space Green Grants

The maximum grant for each scheme is £10,0000 and can contribute towards up to 50% of eligible costs.

Examples of projects that may be funded are:

- Shop front improvements such as signage and brickwork
- Low energy lighting
- Efficient boiler systems
- Insulation
